

buildOn Dinner Raises \$720,000 for Bay Area Youth; Event Honors TMG Partners and SFISD Assistant Superintendent Margaret Chiu

The 10th Annual buildOn Bay Area Dinner raised a record \$720,000 to support buildOn's afterschool service programs in under-resourced Bay Area high schools, and the construction of primary schools in developing countries across the globe.

The Chapter Honoree Award was presented to Corinne Lowe, a high school senior at the Sage Ridge School in Reno, Nev., for rallying her peers to raise funds to build three schools internationally – two in Nicaragua and one in Malawi.

During the evening's program, International Studies Academy high school senior, David "Izzy" Isidoro, shared the story of his transformation, from being involved in a gang to finding a purpose through his buildOn program. The program also previewed buildOn CEO and Founder Jim Ziolkowski's new book, <u>Walk in Their Shoes: Can One Person Change the World</u> (Simon & Schuster 2013), launching on September 17. The evening closed with a <u>video highlighting the many Bay Area residents</u> who have traveled to participate in buildOn's school construction program abroad.
